- Employ a specialist dance teacher for Bollywood dancing for all pupils

- Provide professional development opportunities for our PE coaching team and staff
- Release staff and pay coaches to attend events in all areas of the PE curriculum
- Purchase high quality materials and equipment to support learning in PE and games
- Provide a range of opportunities for enrichment activities after school
- Continue to utilise and be involved in competitive events organised by the local school partnership
