

Music – During the autumn term, the children will be exploring ballads and creating compositions inspired by animation.

Science – In Science, the children will be learning about the skeleton before moving on to nutrition and diet, exploring how we stay healthy.

P.E. – During the autumn term, the children will be taking part in team-skills mini games and orienteering. They will then go on to complete units in dodgeball and tri-golf.

English – Initially, the children will recap key grammatical skills. Through the Talk for Writing approach, they will use a range of texts to learn new grammatical and transcription skills, while also embedding those previously taught in Key Stage One through imitation, innovation and independent application. The books the children will be focusing on are *Splat the Cat*, *After the Fall* and *Story Machine*

Computing – In Computing this term, the children will be exploring data and information by creating pictograms using simple programming.

PSHE – Throughout this half term, the children will be exploring the topics 'Being in My World' and 'Celebrating Differences'. They will learn about rewards and consequences, how to help others feel welcome, and the importance of families and friendships.

R.E. – During our RE lessons, the children will be learning about Sikhi and exploring the question 'Does joining the Khalsa make a person a better Sikh?' They will also study Christianity and consider the question 'Has Christmas lost its meaning?'

French – In French, the children will be exploring French greetings and adjectives. They will develop their skills through speaking, listening and writing activities.

Art – Within our Art lessons, the children will be developing their drawing skills by studying and taking inspiration from the work of Edgar Degas.

D&T – During our designated DT day, the children will be creating pouches using a range of textile skills.

History – During this term, the children will be exploring the question 'How am I making history?' They will compare life in the past with life today and think about what childhood was like for their parents and grandparents.

Maths – In Maths, the children will begin the term by focusing on place value. They will then move on to addition and subtraction, developing their accuracy with the column method. We will finish the autumn term by completing units on shape and multiplication.

Geography – In Geography, the children will be exploring the fascinating topic of volcanoes, focusing especially on why people choose to live near them.
